Background of the Conference

- Asian Judges Symposium on Environmental Decision-Making, the Rule of Law, and Environmental Governance held at ADB in Manila in July 2010.
- Honorable Chief Justice of Pakistan's offer to host a conference on environmental justice in Pakistan seconded by honorable Chief Justice of Indonesia
- Supporting the judges' initiative, ADB prepared a project on "Building Capacity for Environmental Prosecution, Adjudication, Dispute Resolution, Compliance and Enforcement in Asia"
- This project aims at establishing a judges network on the environment and hold roundtables/conferences in SAARC and ASEAN regions. Uptill now:
 - (i) Roundtable for ASEAN judges on Environment was held in Jakarta in December 2011;
 - (ii) SAARC Conference on Environmental Justice in Pakistan



South Asia Conference on Environmental Justice

- This Conference is broadly divided into Inaugural session; Plenary session; 3 Concurrent thematic sessions; and a Closing session
- Each thematic session will prepare its recommendations
- Inaugural session will include welcome, keynote and special addresses
- Plenary Session will discuss environmental jurisprudence and role of the judiciary in addressing environmental challenges followed by overview of common regional environmental challenges like:
 - (i) Urbanization;
 - (ii) Biodiversity loss and deforestation;
 - (iii) Coastal and marine issues;
 - (iv) Air and industrial pollution; and
 - (v) Climate change and floods.



South Asia Conference on Environmental Justice

Concurrent Thematic Sessions are divided into:

(i) Environmental Law and Policy

 Application of International environmental law at a national level; Criminal laws for environmental protection; role of EIA, application of environmental laws, etc

(ii) Environmental Adjudication

 Structure of environmental adjudication, limitations of judiciary in environmental enforcement, effectiveness of tribunals and green benches, etc

(iii) Environmental Education and Capacity Development

 Formal and in-service education and awareness of environmental law, training and capacity building in environmental law, judicial certification program on environment, etc



GENERAL: Role of the Judiciary in Environmental Law Enforcement

Senior judiciary in Asia play a key role in environmental enforcement:

(i) Direct: making environmental decisions, issuing rules and directions to lower courts, establishing green benches
 (ii) Indirect: leading the legal profession towards credible rule-of-law systems that promote environmental sustainability

Influence the entire legal system, how legal and regulatory frameworks are interpreted and enforced which in turn affects private sector investment in related sectors



Theme 1: Environmental Law and Policy

Effective environmental laws dealing with environment as a common global issue
Effective EIAs and IEEs
Effective compliance and enforcement of environmental law
Integrated Enforcement-ORES (Indonesian Example)



Theme 2: Environmental Adjudication

Develop environmental jurisprudence:

 (i) Give effect to constitutional protections – right to a healthy environment as part of right to life
 (ii) Introduce international environmental law principles into national jurisprudence e.g. "precautionary principle," "polluter pays," "sustainable development"
 (iii) Provide concrete remedies to prevent environmental harm or compensate for it e.g. "writ of continuing mandamus"

 Common environmental adjudication set-up: (i) Green courts (e.g. Bangladesh)
 (ii) Green tribunals (e.g. India, Pakistan)

Theme 3: Environmental Education and Capacity Development

- Inclusive responsibility hence awareness of civil society
- Environmental Law as integral part of legal education
- Institutionalization of environmental law training in judicial education, including environmental litigation techniques and dispute resolution



Conclusion: South Asia Conference on Environmental Justice

- Identification of common challenges
- Identification of the role of the judiciary in shaping environmental law and building capacity to decide environmental cases
- Identify the role and nature of South Asia judicial cooperation for strengthening cooperation in areas of mutual benefit, including ensuring continuity of involvement amongst the judiciary.
